

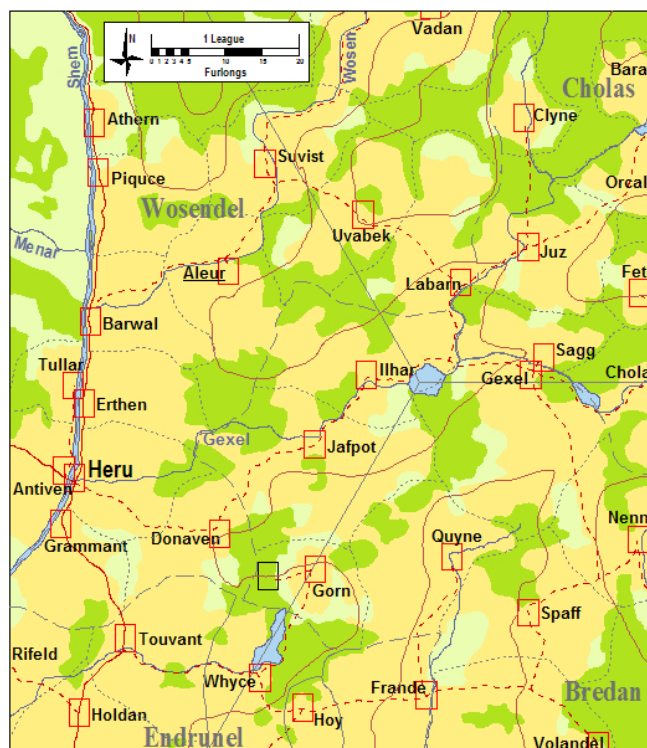
Suvist

Location:	Wosendel Hundred, Semethshire, Kaldor
Holder:	Sir Sterba Yardartha
Allegiance:	Earl of Balim from Sir Parvin Labarn of Labarn Manor
Population:	Village – 197, Manor - 56

Suvist Manor is located on the road to Vaden, Erdace and Ascur Abbeys in the Wosen valley to the northeast of Heru. Lying south of Vaden Abbey, Suvist covers the floor of the river valley with its fertile crop land. The manor is situated between a marshy ford of the Wosen to the south and a small bridge on higher ground to the north. It is held by Sir Sterba Yardartha from Sir Parvin Labarn, who in turn owes allegiance to the Earl of Balim.

History

Suvist manor is believed to have been settled roughly two hundred years ago, being recorded among the manors owing fealty to nearby Heru keep prior to the Baronial Revolt. During the Baronial Revolt, Suvist manor was sacked and burned. The remains of Suvist manor were granted to Sir Tarl Labarn along with two other nearby manors, holding



them from the Earl of Balim.

Suvist was functionally run by a reeve for 20 years, then a succession of bailiffs for 40 years until, in 676, the manor was granted to Delemis Labarn's boon companion, Sir Natar Yardartha. In 700, Sir Sterba succeeded as the lord of Suvist manor with the passing of his father.

Economics

The manor is large and prosperous, supporting several bonded masters in a variety of crafts. Sir Sterba has concentrated his crops in sheep and wheat, almost to the exclusion on other production. Many people, including his liege and reeve have spent considerable effort trying to persuade Sterba to diversify his crops, as an early or late killing frost would be devastating to the manor's economy, possibly causing starvation.

Nevertheless, the prosperity of the manor allows Sir Sterba and his wife, Kelenia, to afford a large household, including a jeweler, clothier, herald and two harpers.

Produce from the manor is generally sold in the Heru market, often for river transport to Tashal. Some of the premium produce is taken directly to Tashal by wagon, usually with Lady Irla Labarn as a broker with the Tashal mangai.

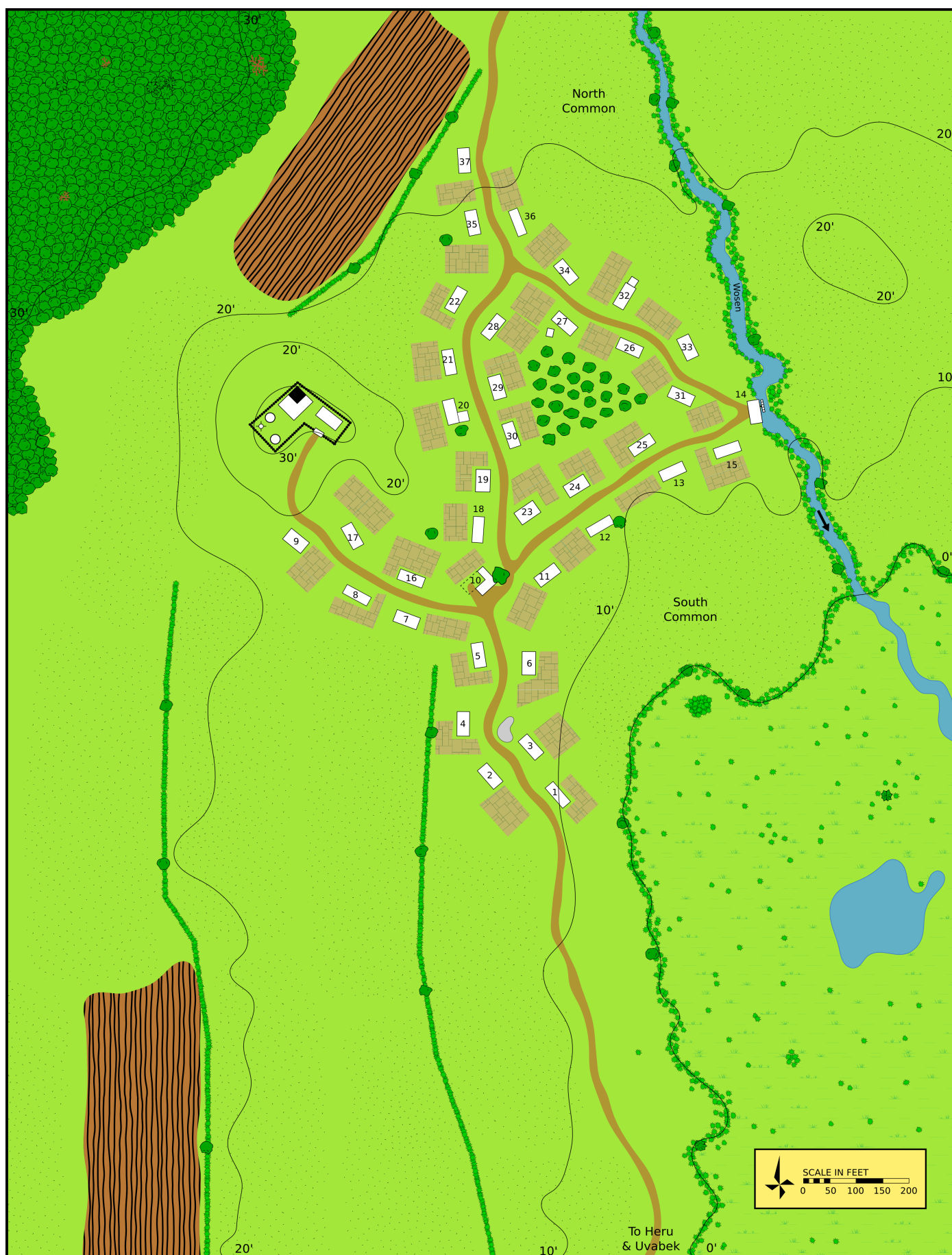
The road through Suvist is fairly busy as it is the only road to the nearby Laranian abbeys. Priests and soldiers routinely pass through the village, many stopping to take in a pint at the Cloverleaf Inn.

Religion

As is typical for a manorial village, the majority of the populace worships Peoni, while the lord and his family worship Larani. To the casual observer, Larani may seem somewhat more prominent than usual due to the nearby abbeys and the traffic they bring through the town.

Current Events

All is not well with Sir Sterba and his wife, Lady Kelenia. Sir Sterba resides at a hunting lodge with a mistress, while Lady Kelenia resides at the manor proper. There is clearly a lot of friction between them, with an unspoken core problem. While a few people take sides in the issue, most residents avoid the subject.



Suvist Village

1. Melyn of Irin, Villein (6)

Melyn is a conservative man, always storing extra grain for winter and taking precautions against future hazards. Alas, Melyn is also somewhat gullible, and will buy charms against disease, drowning, impotence, etc.

2. Huri of Tarbel, Half Villein (8)

Huri is a devout worshiper of Peoni. He is getting old to be out in the fields every day, but is reluctant to turn over the day to day management of his family's meager holdings to his oldest son.

3. Vandai of Kaberen, Yeoman (3)

Vandai is a somewhat lazy man. While he doesn't shirk his duty, he always has a reason why the task at hand doesn't need to be done now. He serves as a light footman.

4. Aran of Tarbel, Farmer (9)

Aran is an extremely hard working farmer. He is perpetually tired because of his long hours. This sometimes makes him a bit short tempered.

5. Hariben of Urgelus, Villein (6)

Hariben is a man given to pondering the great mysteries of life. While he will happily discuss philosophy with any learned man who should happen by, he pays somewhat less attention to the practical matters of life in Suvist.

6. Tarak of Dybel, Villein (5)

Tarak is a man torn between security and wealth. He raises goats and rye since he knows they are quite hardy but is always disappointed with the price he gets. To resolve this, he has begun shorting his bushels, which will eventually get him into some trouble.

7. Ortin of Urgelis, Woodward (2)

Ortin is a hard man to get along with. While he is a hard worker and always fulfills his obligations, he expects others to do as they are told. As a result, the village beadle is one of the few people who likes him.

8. Usrynan of Kraten, Trapper (5)

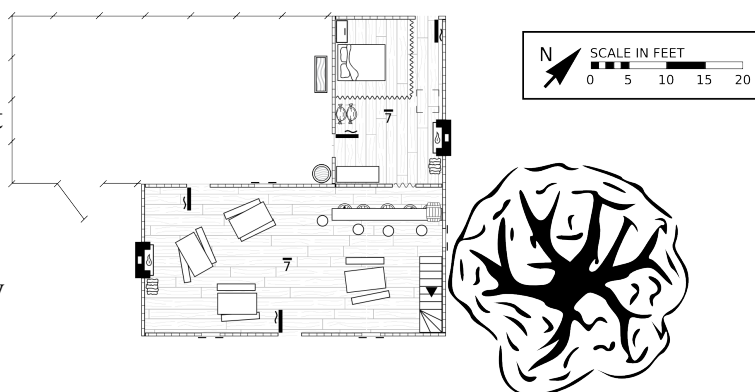
Usrynan recently encountered some bandits in the woods northwest of Suvist. The leader appeared to be a knight and threatened violent reprisal against Usrynan if he told anyone. Usrynan is deathly afraid of what might happen, and is contemplating running away.

9. Rinsa of Urgelis, Farmer (3)

Rinsa is a rich farmer and is publicly proud of his standing in the community. Sadly, Rinsa is also impotent. His wife dallies with Birlen of Nela [29], a fact that occasionally drives Rinsa to drink heavily.

10. Ulon of Arion, Innkeeper (7)

Ulon runs the Cloverleaf Inn. It is a comfortable inn and Ulon makes excellent beer that attracts customers from the nearby villages and abbeys. Alas, Ulon is a bit too fond of his own product, and as the night wears on frequently loses track of who owes him what.

11. Bathan of Mebelin, Beadle (6)

Bathan is getting old for a beadle. However, he has a keen notion of who the trouble makers in the village are and is trusted by Sir Sterba. Bathan has realized what is going on between Sir Sterba and Lady Kelenia, but has no authority to act.

12. Ebrel of Asten, Trapper (11)

Ebrel has supported his large family for years based on his knowledge of herbs and local reputation as a healer. However, age has taking its toll, and Ebrel is wasting away. Everyone thinks Ebrel would know how to heal himself if only he were healthy enough to help himself.

13. Lornin of Perbel, Trapper (5)

Lornin has maintained the same trapping and fishing locations in the marsh to the southeast as his father did. Unfortunately, things have gradually changed over the years, and Lornin has not adjusted, leading to a decline in Lornin's success.

14. Jeldon of Barion, Miller (4)

Jeldon is a young master miller who is expanding the current mill. The older residents of Suvist know how violent Wosen stream can get when it floods and are worried that Jeldon isn't making the addition strong enough.

15. Argen of Kraten, Yeoman (3)

Argen serves as a longbowman. Argen is constantly making a new bow to try to create something better, but thus far all of his efforts have failed.

16. Erdarn of Asten, Farmer (6)

Erdarn is a man perpetually worried about something. While he is a caring husband and father, his concern for his family often manifests as excessively overbearing rules.

17. Farquey of Kabaren, Half-Villein (4)

Farquey is a good worker, and is much admired in the village for his ability to get things done quickly. However, he also spends a lot of time building odd things. He rarely tells anyone what an object is for – often it just didn't work out.

18. Tamino of Kraten, Villein (6)

Tamino is recovering from a severe injury caused by his own neglect. It is widely hoped that this will be a lesson to Tamino, as he often doesn't take the time to make sure things are secure.

19. Baran of Mebelin, Villein (4)

Baran is a pious Peonian with a dishonest streak. This has vexed the local priest, Liris [32], in the past. However, Baran has been a great help to Liris with the death of sister.

20. Eris of Tyungen, Metalsmith (5) **

Eris, the village smith, is a quiet middle aged man of deep religious conviction.

21. Lanas of Urgelis, Villein (3)

Lanas is one of the few villagers who has wholeheartedly embraced the change in the crops instituted by Sir Sterba. This has made him wealthier and gained him favor with Sir Sterba.

22. Ondro of Mebelin, Half-Villein (12)

Ondro Mebelin is a strong man who works hard to support his large family. Recently, Ondro had to protect his daughter from a drunken soldier of Larani visiting the Cloverleaf Inn [10]. The drunken soldier has sworn revenge for being struck, which concerns everyone involved.

23. Harkel of Mebelin, Trapper (8)

Harkel is a somewhat dim man, who can reasonably be expected to do as he is told. Most of the time, his wife tells him what to do.

24. Purand of Mebelin, Reeve (4)

Purand is deeply concerned about the risk that Sir Sterba is taking with the crops and herds. On more than one occasion, he has struggled to avoid trying to shake some sense into Sir Sterba.

25. Lian of Irin, Villein (7)

Lian is the proud father of newborn triplets. He tells everyone that the family is fine, but it is widely known that his wife and three babes are weak. It seems only a matter of time before death claims one or more of them.

26. Lotin of Dybel, Villein (7)

Lotin is an old man who was at death's door this past winter. He is better now, but still lacks the energy to do all the things he would like.

27. Peser of Ashelwen, Salter (5)

**

Peser makes reasonable cheeses and hams. He is convinced there is an old Khuzan salt mine hidden in the hills to the northwest and spends a fair amount of time looking for it.

28. Tarlin of Nela, Yeoman (5)

Tarlin is a good shot with a bow. He is hard working and honest, but often underestimates how long something will take to do.

29. Berlin of Nela, Trapper (2)

Berlin is the younger brother of Tarlin. He is a good woodsman, but lacks his brother's sense of duty.

30. Tordin of Nela, Trapper (2)

Tordin is the youngest of the Nela brothers. He works hard at trapping, and tends to stick to the same routine, not trying anything new.

31. Sonan of Dybel, Herder (7)

Sonan keeps an exacting schedule on the usage of the various pastures to ensure no overgrazing occurs.

32. Liris of Kail, Priest (5)

Liris is the local priest of Peoni. The recent death of his younger sister has caused him a crisis of faith.

33. Yordag of Mebelin, Villein (4)

Yordag is a strong and ambitious man. Supported by his cousin Purand, the village reeve, Yordag aspires to become the village herder.

34. Gant of Asten, Cottar (5)

Gant is a man of very modest mean who doesn't seem to aspire to more. The last few years have been good for Suvist, so Gant's family have been OK, but a bad year would fall very hard on them.

35. Eribir of Kabaren, Farmer (2)

Eribir is in his late 60's and works his 20 acre farm despite the fact that age has taken its toll. It is widely assumed that his son Farquey will take over the farm someday not too far off, but for now Eribir continues to work.

36. Wereda of Tarbel, Villein (7)

Wereda has gained a certain notoriety in Suvist for confronting a Laranian soldier cheating at dice last fall.

37. Jorran of Nela, Villein (2)

Jorran is an honest man who will not hold back the truth. This has nearly gotten him in trouble with Sir Sterba a couple of times in the last year.



Suvist Manor

Ground Level

1. Gatehouse

The manor has a somewhat typical gatehouse. Arabis of Tobris, a man at arms, resides here and stands guard at the gate during the day.

2. Stables

The stables are barely large enough to house the twelve steeds that make up the household's herd.

Above the stable is a large hay loft while several household servants reside behind the stables proper.

[a] Aran of Daberis is an old bonded master jeweler, providing silver jewelry for Lady Kelenia and her mother, Lady Julyn. He resides here with his apprentice.

[b] Hargan of Krastal is the ostler in charge of the stable. He is assisted by two squires and Eberard of Kobosa, the teamster. His wife, Mella, is the baker of the manor house, while their three sons assist as needed around the manor.

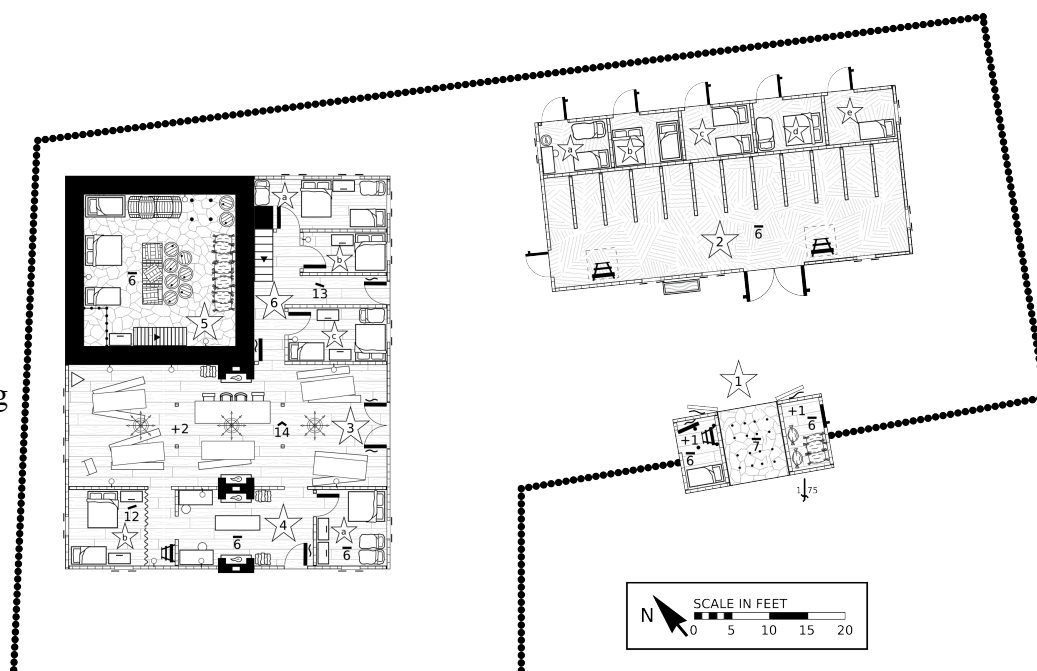
[c] Everard of Kobosa resides in this room along with Hargan's eldest son.

[d] Ralda of Uberma is the master of the kennels. His wife works as a domestic servant in the manor house. They have one seven year old son.

[e] Largo of Drelis is the master falconer. He is old, but cares well for his birds.

3. Great Hall

The great hall fills the center of the manor house, with two fire places and three chandeliers. The lord's table is situated in the center of the hall, with nice chairs for the lord and lady of the manor.



Ground Floor

Above the hall hang various drying/curing meats and vegetables. On Laranian holy days, services are held in the great hall.

4. Kitchen

Always a busy place, the kitchen has two fireplaces available for cooking, though only one is in use for most occasions.

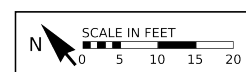
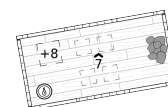
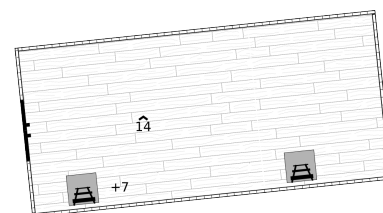
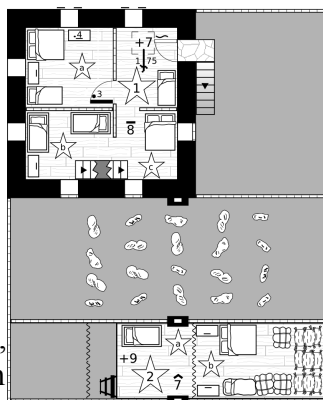
[a] Koron of Rybela, the lady's harper, and his family reside in a former storeroom to the southeast. Koron, a middle aged flautist, works with his young wife, Pella, who is lutist and fine singer. They have two sons aged five and two plus a newborn son.

[b] The lord's Priestess of Larani, Ebri of Kanefren resides in the alcove to the northwest with her husband and daughter. Her husband, Tarad, is retired as a soldier from the Lady of Paladins and is employed by the lord as a man at arms. The couple's daughter, Lyrel, is recently widowed and staying with her parents for support.

5. Cellar

The tower's cellar is very similar to others found throughout Kaldor. A small cell holds the occasional prisoner, usually a drunken breaker of the peace. It is filled with a variety of stores.

Limitations on space in the manor have forced the lady's elderly cellarer, Coldin of Obria, to take up residence here with his family. His wife, Delena, is the manor's alewife. They have twin daughters aged 15 who work as servants in the manor and a five year old daughter.



First Floor

6. Chamberlain

This area has been subdivided to provide rooms for the household's more valued tenants.

[a] The household physician, Aryl of Keriswen, resides in the room nearest the stairs with his wife, Evadia, and three young children. Evadia works as a tutor to the lady's sons.

[b] The manor's chamberlain, Orlin of Armel, resides in the next room with his wife, Delael. Delael is the manor's head cook and between them, Orlin and Delael are in charge of all of the manor's various servants and craftsmen.

[c] The last room is the residence of Onden of Ewen, the manor's herald, and his family. His wife, Alesyn, works as a domestic servant in the manor. They have an eight year old daughter and a two year old son.

[a] The north room is nominally the lord and lady's room. As a practical matter, Sir Sterba rarely stays here (see Sterba's Plight below) and Lady Kelenia's mother, Lady Julyn Belgine, stays in the room with Lady Kelenia.

[b] Lady Kelenia's sons, Braga and Harael, stay in the northwest room along with the squires when Sir Sterba is in residence. When the squires are not present, the extra beds are taken up by Irdal of Meriel's young sons.

[c] Irdal and his wife, Nycia, reside in the southern room with the stairs to the roof of the tower. Nycia is also a servant to Lady Kelenia, and the first roused for any nighttime need.

2. Loft

[a] The loft above the kitchen is the residence of the old gardener, Jomin of Nela and his daughter, Lynila. Jomin is somewhat anxious that his daughter get married, but Lynila does not seem to take any interest in the various men she meets.

[b] The loft is shared by the lady's clothier, Asal of Sedor, his wife and his apprentice. Together, they manage to keep Lady Kelenia and the household well clothed. As a devout Peonian, Asal makes sure that the worn clothes of the household go to those who need it the most.

First Floor

1. Tower

The tower houses the lord's family and their immediate servants. The entry chamber is guarded by Sered of Banadar, a young man at arms. It includes a bed in the corner for him to sleep on.

Sterba's Plight

Eleven years ago a younger Sterba Yardartha received letters from knights of Larani requesting his assistance with taking care of a problem. He also received a letter dated shortly after the assassination of Archbishop Kalabin Elensa thanking him for his good work.

His wife, Kelenia, found the letters and although the letters were vague in their reference to what the problem was or who the people involved were, the date caused her to come to the worst possible conclusion. Sterba tried to convince Kelenia he wasn't involved in the death of the archbishop, but she refused to listen to him. While Sterba was present at his manor when the Archbishop was killed, the papers combined with Kelenia's testimony could certainly be enough to try him and possibly convict him of the murder or at least being a conspirator.

Sir Yardartha's wife, Kelenia, is a shrewd woman and ambitious. She realized that revealing Sterba's indiscretion would result in her becoming a poor widow with few prospects of changing that fate. Instead, Kelenia collected all the evidence she could. At first to keep anyone else from finding it, but later with the idea in mind that it would be useful for getting what she wanted out of Sterba.

When Kelenia had been young, she had set her sights on marrying Haral Labarn. He was handsome, brave, intelligent, and squired to her father. Young and infatuated, Kelenia believed young Haral's innocent flirtations were more than they were. She had expected a proposal after he had been knighted, but that hadn't been what happened. Instead he married Irla Azorn. Kelenia was furious, beside herself with jealousy and anger, and is still venomously hateful of Irla. Kelenia's jealousy of Irla led Kelenia to decide she must have better and more than Irla, whatever it is.

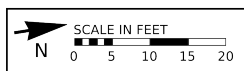
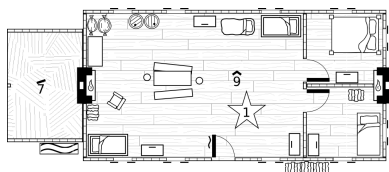
When Haral contracted with a second clothier, she demanded Sterba provide her with a second as well, and a jeweler, and a second maid, and scribe, and her mother living with them. Since Irla moved to Tashal, Kelenia has been demanding a townhouse as well.

Sir Sterba would now be a happy man if he could only find the papers and thereby nullify his wife's blackmailing ability. He has looked everywhere he can think of – the entire manor house, all the out buildings, he has questioned both priests, even asked Haral Labarn and searched his mother-in-law's belongings when she moved in, all to no avail.

Kelenia, knowing that if Sterba ever found the documents they would be destroyed, took care to remove them from his reach before telling him of their existence. She sent them, along with a sum of money, to a litigant's office in Tashal. The sum of money was enough to keep them stored securely for many years. The litigant, Ymar of Elwen, is now an old man, and will soon be selling his business or possibly die, at which time the case will either be returned, or a bill for continued safe keeping sent to Suvist Manor.

Over the years Sterba has shifted the production of his manor almost exclusively into wheat and sheep in order to try to bring in enough income to satisfy Kelenia's demands. Sir Sterba has tried to explain that the manor will not support her demands, that the Labarns have more land and that Kelenia is being a bit unreasonable. All of it has fallen on deaf ears.

In the meantime Sterba and Kelenia have come to lead separate lives in the same manor. Several years ago Sterba took a mistress, Derenesa, by whom he has several children. Kelenia will not allow them in the manor house and makes life as hard as possible for them. Sterba and Derenesa, along with the huntsman and two squires, reside in a hunting lodge in the forest to the north of the village.



If Sterba can obtain the blackmail papers, he plans to recognize Derenesa's children publicly. In addition, Harael is not Sterba's child, but was fathered by another knight; Sterba is aware the child is not his. Sterba so loathes his wife that if he were able to obtain the papers, he would divorce her out. Sir Sterba does support Derenesa and her children as best as he can, but he cannot spend as much as he would like to on their upkeep as Kelenia's demands leave the manor finances in a precarious state.

While Sterba dreams of being able to cut his expenditures after relieving himself of his wife, in reality the additional cost of recognizing Derenesa's children will negate most of his savings. Only after the bachelor Knight and oldest squire leave the household will he see a significant reduction in his household expenditures.

Clan Yardartha

Yardartha is a small clan, founded by Sir Natar, who was rumored to be a bastard child of Horaxa Labarn. Whatever his parentage, Natar was the boon companion of Horaxa's eldest son, Delemis. Raised in Horaxa's household, Natar was knighted along with Delemis and accompanied him to the Battle of the Chelna Gap where Delemis died. In 676, Horaxa granted Suvist manor to Sir Natar.

Sir Natar had three daughters and two sons. Sir Sterba, the elder brother, is the current head of the clan and lord of Suvist manor. Sir Sterba's younger brother, Worlic, is a priest in the church of Larani. He is a rather honest, if somewhat lazy clergyman.



Sir Sterba's older sister, Pelias, is married to the bailiff of Grammant manor to the south of Heru. Her husband's health is failing, and she is trying to manage the manor, but is finding resistance among the peasants, who know she is not likely to continue as bailiff.

The middle sister, Haelina, has never been a particularly bright person. When her first husband died, she opted to marry a guildsman from Tashal, mistaking him for a guildmaster.

The youngest sister, Lyrlias, married the lord of Nerield manor near Kobing. She died seven years ago, and her children have little to do with their relatives to the north.

Author's Notes

This article is one of a series concerning the holdings of the Labarn clan in Kaldor. The Labarn clan's holdings (5 manors) are significantly greater than ordinary knights, such that Sir Parvin Labarn might be thought of as a 'baronet', should such a title be recognized in Kaldor.

The clan also holds a townhouse in the Haldana section of Tashal, while distant cousins hold positions of importance in Vemionshire.
